Sinyi Group Statement of Biodiversity Commitment

Sinyi Group understands that biodiversity is crucial not only to the survival of lives but also to the development of human civilization. We are conscious of the intrinsic value of biological diversity, of the ecological, genetic, social, economic, scientific, educational, cultural, recreational and aesthetic values of biological diversity and its components and also of the importance of biological diversity for evolution and for maintaining life sustaining systems of the biosphere. We affirm that the conservation of biological diversity is a common concern of humankind.

Whereas convention on biodiversity is helpful in the mitigation and adaptation for climate change with positive significance to the agricultural development, food safety, public hygiene, and sustainable economic development, we make this Statement of Biodiversity Commitment in reference to the spirit of United Nations Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) with the goals of conservation of biodiversity; sustainable use of diversity; and the fair and equitable sharing of the benefits arising from the use of genetic resources; therefore fulfilling the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) no. 12, 13, 14, 15, and 17.

Sinyi Group commits to:

- 1. compliance of operational activities with international, national, and municipal biodiversity-related law and regulations.
- 2. avoidance of negative impacts on threatened and protected species by the operational activities.
- 3. not explore or develop in legally designed protected biodiversity areas.
- 4. respect legally designated protected biodiversity areas.
- 5. no conversion of High Convention Value (HCV) areas.
- 6. no trade of operating-related services or goods relate to threatened or endangered species listed on the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) Red List or on the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES).
- 7. knowingly no direct procurement from suppliers who involved in loss of biodiversity and illegal deforestation.
- 8. support biodiversity convention activities or initiatives.
- 9. Seek the opportunities for natural carbon sinks, including forest, soil, and the ocean.
- 10. Introduce proper approach for biodiversity risks evaluation and management, such as mitigation hierarchy approach that includes avoidance, minimization, remediation, and offset; therefore to achieve Net Positive Gain or No Net Loss.
- 11. secure Free, Prior and Informed Consent (FPIC) of Indigenous Peoples
- 12. encourage our suppliers to contribute to convention on biodiversity by making this commitment together.
